This ignited a life-long interest in student wellbeing and the power of targeted early intervention in shaping positive outcomes for children and their families.

In 2017 I was honoured to receive the *John Laing Award for Professional Development*, which was managed by the then *Principals Australia Institute (PAI)*, where I was one of five school leaders across all sectors from Western Australia officially recognised for dedication to education and professional learning.

With a strong interest in Positive Psychology, I also served as the inaugural Vice-Chair of the *Positive Education Schools Association (PESA)* WA Branch.

One of my proudest achievements outside of schooling is the *Kids Are Kids Therapy and Education Centre*. I co-founded this not-for-profit organisation and have been the long serving Chairperson. *Kids Are Kids* is a family centred organisation that has provided a caring, expert range of allied health services such as Speech Pathology, Occupational Therapy and Clinical Psychology to children and their families across WA for more than 24 years.
