Application for Enrolment

A \$300 non-refundable and non-transferable fee is payable on application to waitlist for possible future enrolment to the School (including Hampshire House).

Enrolment Fee

Once a place has been confirmed and accepted, a non-refundable and non-transferable enrolment fee of \$6,000 is required to secure the position.

This fee is not credited against tuition fees.

Methods of Payment

Fees may be paid via the following methods:

2. Credit card – note that a merchant fee of 1.1% for Visa, Mastercard and Amex will be applied.
3. Bpay – Biller Code and Customer Number are printed on your fee statements.
4. Direct Debit – Direct debit forms are available [here](#) and allow parents to pay tuition fees in instalments. Completed forms are to be submitted by email to schoolfees@kambala.nsw.edu.au.

Terms and Conditions

Please refer to the full Terms and Conditions in accordance with your enrolment contract from the Enrolments Office.

- Fees are set on an annual basis by the School Council however the Council reserves the right to change the fees at any time.
- Fees and charges will be invoiced each term. Refer to the payment due dates on the previous page.
- All fees and charges are payable on the due date. A late payment fee of \$200 applies.
- New families joining in the forthcoming year will be required to pay Term 1 fees in advance during Term 3 of the prior year.
- Liability for payment of accounts rests jointly and severally with the person(s) signing the Enrolment Application form. If both parents have signed the Acceptance form, one parent cannot remove themselves from the enrolment contract without written consent from the School and the other enrolling parent.
- The School reserves the right to notify the parents that their daughter(s) will not be permitted to return to Kambala until overdue fees, charges, and arrears have been paid.
- Any student whose fees remain overdue will be ineligible to enrol or participate in optional extra-curricular activity, such as overseas tours, student exchanges, individual music tuition, until the account is settled accordingly.

Full Fee-Paying Overseas Students

Students requiring a student visa to study in Australia are known as Full Fee Paying Overseas Students (FFPOS). These students do not attract government subsidies and therefore pay additional funds to enrol at Kambala.

In addition to the Kambala registration, enrolment, tuition and boarding fees (if applicable), overseas students will pay:

1. A refundable international student deposit of \$10,000 to be paid one month prior to the agreed entry date. The \$10,000 will be refunded at the completion of the student's schooling. A credit card will not be accepted for this payment.
2. An Annual Supplementation Fee levied at the beginning of Term 1 each year.

Overdue Accounts

If you are having difficulty paying your account, please contact the Business Office on 9388 6858. If an account remains unpaid after the fee due date, a reminder notice will be sent and an administration charge of \$200 will apply. If the account remains unpaid, a final demand letter will follow. In addition, students may not be allowed to return to School until all fees have been paid. Thereafter, external debt collectors may be used, the costs of which will be billed to your account.

Fees in Advance

- Tuition and Boarding fees may be paid in advance for the current year only. If you wish to proceed with this option, please email schoolfees@kambala.nsw.edu.au. No discount is applied to fees paid in advance. New families joining the School will be required to pay Term 1 fees in Term 3, the year prior to commencement.

Additional Charges

In addition to tuition fees, a compulsory levy is charged to cover:

- year group curriculum activities
- excursions
- publications
- consumable materials
- student laptop/IPAD devices supplied (inc. warranty, insurance, software)
- year group camps

The levy is charged over four terms and added to your termly billing.

The levy is not partly refundable should a student withdraw through an academic year, nor are any charges relating to compulsory programs, should a student not attend. Families receiving sibling rebates will not receive remission on these charges.

Extra Curricular

Extra curricular charges are incurred by families whose daughter/s participate in extra curricular activities. Those costs are paid by families via clipboard at time of registration.

Donations to Kambala

All parents are encouraged to contribute to Kambala's voluntary donations program. Donations to the Kambala Building Fund and Kambala Scholarship Fund are fully tax deductible, greatly appreciated, and will enable the School to enhance its program offerings.

Voluntary Building Fund Donation

- Building programs rely to a large extent on money raised through voluntary contributions to Kambala's Building Fund.
- These donations are fully tax deductible and greatly assist the School in maintaining and upgrading its buildings and facilities. All students directly benefit from donations to the Building Fund.
- An opportunity to make an income tax deductible donation of \$300 is provided with each term's statement of account.
- A tax receipt summary will be sent at the end of the financial year.



Fee Discounts

- A 10% discount will apply to tuition fees for the second and subsequent daughter(s) concurrently attending Kambala. When an older sibling:
 - ◆ Is receiving a discount or any reduction on school fees, the sibling discount will be reduced on a pro-rata basis.
 - ◆ Where a student is eligible for more than one discount, the student will receive the larger of the two discounts, and the discounts will not be cumulative.
- Where a student receives a sibling rebate and a scholarship, the scholarship is applied to the net balance after the application of the sibling rebate.
- In addition to the tuition discount above, boarders who are second and subsequent siblings will receive a discount on boarding fees while concurrently boarding at Kambala. Second daughter will receive a 25% discount and the third and subsequent daughters will receive a 50% discount. When an older sibling is receiving a discount or any reduction on school fees, the sibling discount will be reduced on a pro-rata basis.

Scholarships and Bursaries

Tuition and boarding fees may be remitted by way of either a scholarship or bursary for all or part of the fees:

- ◆ Scholarships are awarded annually through competitive examination and interview process.
- ◆ Bursaries are subject to interview and are means tested.

All scholarships and bursaries are awarded for tuition and/or boarding fees only and on some occasions levies.

Goods & Services Tax

Tuition fees and many associated charges do not incur Goods & Services Tax. There are however a small number of educational related supplies (i.e. school uniforms) that are subject to GST. The School will charge the tax to parents where applicable.

Notice of Withdrawal

- A full term's notice, in writing and addressed to the Principal, is required if a student is to be withdrawn from Kambala, or to change a student from a boarder to day girl. Notice must be received by day one of the student's final term at Kambala. If insufficient notice is given, one term's fees in lieu of notice (tuition and boarding fees as applicable) applies.
- This also applies to new students who have accepted a place but withdraw before commencing.
- Boarding fees are payable for the whole year unless a student is accepted for a lesser period. Liability for the year's boarding fee is unaltered by withdrawal during the year. The School requires a semester's notice in advance if students plan on not returning to the Boarding House.
