host plant: pea flowers, introduced clovers and lucerne

host plant: native and introduced grasses and sedges

Cabbage White

host plant: common weeds such as mustard weed, nasturtium, and also plants in the cabbage family (Brassicac)

host plant: native everlasting daisies, cudweeds, pasture weeds such as thistles and Capeweed

host plant: native and introduced nettles such as Stinging Nettle
