The role of Inclusive Education Teacher will work within the Inclusive Education team reporting to the Head of Inclusive Education and the College Director of Teaching and Learning to plan, support and deliver quality Australian curriculum to students whilst upholding to the College pedagogy. The Inclusive Education team works in conjunction with both the academic and pastoral care teams to oversee students with diverse learning needs.

The role requires a strong focus on providing outstanding support to students with disability and their families whilst liaising with specialist personal relevant to the students' needs. This is an integral part of the Riverside Teaching & Learning Framework that provides a quality Christian education. The teaching structure within the College is informed by the Australian Professional Standards for Teachers (AITSL) and the *National School Improvement Tool* (ACER).

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Collaborate with parents, carers, and teachers to produce Support Plans and ESPs.
- Assist Head of Inclusive Education to maintain processes used to receive funding for students with disability.
- Complete verification documentation and reviews for students with disability.
- Assist in completion of National Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) processes for students with disability.
- Assist teachers with providing in-class adjustments to students, appropriate to their needs.
- Liaising with specialist personnel to provide services to individual students.
- Supporting students with a wide range of difficulties and disabilities in the classroom where required.
- Support ISA and other Inclusive Education staff in carrying out their tasks successfully.
- Participating in ongoing professional development to master the components of the Teaching and Learning Framework adopted by the College.
- Maintain confidentiality of sensitive information.
- Establish and maintain relationships with all stakeholders including parents, relevant community bodies and colleagues.
- Maintain resources, equipment, and the physical environment to the highest standards and placing student safety as paramount in day-to-day operations.
- Comply with College policies, procedures, and practices, including WHS and the Staff Code of Conduct.



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POSITION REQUIREMENTS

- Teaching qualifications is essential.
- Demonstrated experience and or teaching qualifications in the field of Special Education is preferred.
