President's Report

It is with significant pride that I present the 68th annual report to our membership. The surf club reopened on the 21st of December 2023, just over six months ago with our new home embraced by our members and the local community. As a Club we still have work to make our new house a home, but I must thank all our members for their understanding and support in this incredible achievement. This new facility is creating great prospects for our members, and I am excited about the opportunities that as a club we will have opening to us in the coming years.

As president I would like to thank the board on behalf of our membership for their outstanding commitment, relentless drive, and enduring support over the past season. Special thanks to our club secretary Julie Goldner for her continuing work and support, especially with the constitutional review, coordination of the Official Opening Ceremony and Annual Presentation evening.

It is difficult to separate our achievements. The new Club house, the West Beach Surf club logo, the Junior area Scott Rathman artwork in the foyer, our competition highlights on the beach and in the pool, the Pink and Blue Swim, the Surf Club official opening and the presentation evenings all have been outstanding successes but have all merged together as part of an outstanding year.

The Club Person of the Year awarded to Shayan Gunawardena, recognising the extra-ordinary effort performed by him, as the Chief instructor, Club Assessor and trainer, patrol captain, and collaborating with John Fitzgerald and Georgia Brazenall in the Constitution and By-laws review. Shayan at a State level is part of the financial oversight committee, State assessor and facilitator and is part of the Emergency operations group. His skills and knowledge combined with his constant willingness to assist makes him a corner stone of our club operations and a worthy recipient of the Club person of the year award.

Finance

Jacqui Pugsley in her first year as finance director had the unenviable task of managing the financials for the new surf club building and reporting on the Beachside and the West Beach Bar & Bistro financials. She has done an outstanding job this season and the improvements in the financial structures implemented with Paul Cenko will make tracking of the club financial position easier.

The turnover for the West Beach Bar & Bistro recorded this year was outstanding considering the venue opened on the 21st of December and had little over three months of trading in the 2023/24 fiscal year. The financial report shows a significant income from Council, State and Federal government grants and loans from Bendigo Bank and Kanini as part of the funding for the new club development and fit out. The loan repayments are serviced from the Bar and Bistro operations and the club has made significant repayments on these loans. The income received from Beachside is not included as part of the West Beach Surf lifesaving club financial report for this season as the business plans to be closed and consolidated as of the 30th of June 2024.

Facilities

With the management of multiple locations, the move from Beachside into the new club facility and coordinating the improvements and rectification work in the new building has greatly increased the work of the facilities director. Ben Lawrence has done an outstanding effort in this role, coordinating and organising this work and I thank him for his tireless support and commitment this season. The major building works is now complete with only minor improvements planned for the coming season.

Commercial

Norm Collins and the Staff worked incredibly hard to transition from the Beachside venue to the West

Beach Surf Club Bar and Bistro and then manage the wave of popularity of the new surf club opening. The popularity of the new venue made the appointment of a paid venue manager necessary, and Norm Collins agreed to step down from the board and fulfill this role while the venue operations stabilise. On behalf of the West Beach members, I would like to personally thank Norm, Ben, Kate, and Joshi for the outstanding work over the past year which has enabled West Beach SLSC to be in its current financial and operational position.

Strategy, Risk and Audit

The West Beach Strategic plan moved into the implementation phase with the five work groups working on the year one initiatives with varied success. The Strong Culture group has achieved notable success with it define WBSLSC values and I look forward to the implementation of the year two initiatives from these work groups to setup the direction and goals for the club. I strongly encourage our members to be part of these initiatives as these groups will help set the club's direction and goals for the coming seasons.

Building Project

The building project commenced in August 2022 and completed in December 2023 opening for the Christmas holiday period. Achieving the Christmas opening and managing the building financial commitment was critical and I would like to thank the West Beach building committees and Jon Westover from the board for their constant oversight and Walter Brook and Partek for their professionalism and quality of building.

Compliance and Marketing

Christine Newberry again managed the difficult area of Compliance along with the portfolio of Marketing this year. As the Club operations grow and legislation constantly changes, our obligation and accountability continue to increase, and it is a difficult role managing this area in both the volunteer arena and commercial operations. With

the introduction of the new building, we asked our members if we should replace the original club logo with a new design which now appears on the front of the building, media releases and our uniforms. Christine coordinated and drove its implementation and managed to control the individual areas to achieve this outstanding result.

Lifesaving Services

Ellen Newberry and her team continued managing the Lifesaving and Educations area from trailers, shipping containers and emergency equipment housed in Henley Sailing Club. The coordination of patrols, proficiencies, award training and movement of equipment between locations and supporting club activities is a credit to the lifesaving and education teams. The West Beach Surf Club appreciated Henley Sailing Club's support through this period and look forward to a closer supportive relationship with them.

Youth Development

The Youth area under Sarah Kemp continues to grow this season with junior's now the largest membership of the club. With the moving into the new club facilities this area will continue to grow and need support. As part of youths program the Juniors provided a range of community engagement activities including the partnership with SLSSA and Tjindu foundation. West Beach is proud to be one of the four clubs statewide to be part of this program.

Surf Sports

Jenni Carberry and the surf sports team continue to build with impressive results this season from a state and national level with our youth athletes' representation on the State and National Surf League teams. Our master and pool lifesaving competitors also achieved outstanding results with West Beach winning both State championships. Jenni has done an outstanding effort managing this area and I thank her for her professionalism and guidance that she provides as part of the board.

As I said in the opening, the new club facilities will provide us with great opportunities over the next decade. It is up to all our members to embrace these opportunities.

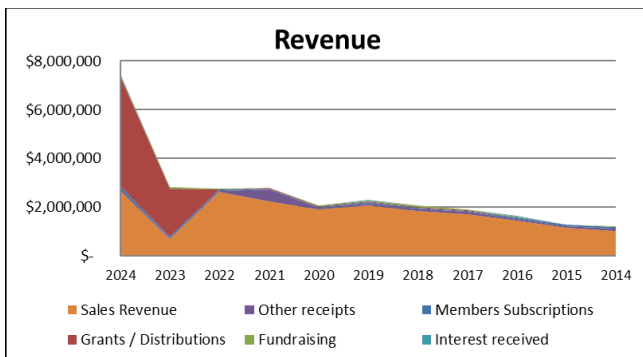
Finance

In the 2023/2024 season the total income was bolstered by the Bar & Bistro reopening in late December as well as grants received for the redevelopment.

The Bar & Bistro turnover for the year was \$2,642,134 and generated an operating profit of \$852,415. This is a phenomenal result given trading commenced on 21st December.

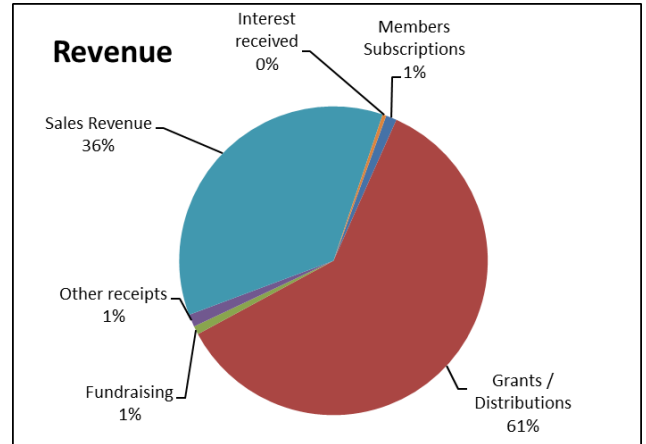
Sales of clothing and merchandise generated a profit of \$9,570, which was 11% higher than last season.

Grants and distributions were the Club's highest income stream for the 2023/2024 season at \$4,503,595. Most of the grants were from the Federal government and State government.



The club took out loans totalling \$1,830,000 during the year to help pay for the redevelopment. By the end of March 2024 we had made payments totalling \$700,000 towards these loans.

Other Surf Club Operations, excluding clothing and grants, generated revenue of \$213,107 and an operating loss of \$43,605.

Total cash on hand at the end of the year was \$550,946. This was down on the prior year due to payments towards the redevelopment and repayments of the loans.

Beachside Restaurant was successfully sold at the end of November 2023 for a purchase price of \$350k. Beachside's turnover for the period 1-Jul-23 to 31-Mar-24 was \$791.9k and other income was \$361k including the proceeds from sale of Beachside and interest income. Beachside's financials will be finalised after the end of their fiscal year on 30-Jun-24 and then the final distribution will be paid to the club. The distribution is yet to be determined.

Facilities



The year in blur.....

We had 8 months at Beachside during this year and this was a constant challenge for maintenance. The increased numbers at Beachside brought issues with electrical supply and gas supply, wear and tear on everything, sewerage, plumbing and fitting in the club activities. With the help of our members and dedicated community members we were able to get through to a fabulous result for our Club when it was sold.

Our members were extremely flexible with operations from 5 separate locations – Beachside, blue containers, Henley Sailing Club, Verve Shed and our shed. We had many competing goals for use of storage of trailers and equipment and there were very very few issues. It was great.

Our small Gym worked well but doesn't compare to our new facilities. The lease was terminated when our new club opened.

The Ute: What an asset this has proved to be. The best \$9000 we ever spent. She is looking a little tired and I have planned some maintenance on it before the next season.

We still have 2 ATVs. The plan is to sell the older one. We don't think we need it and it is taking up valuable real-estate.

Our shed at West Beach Park continues to be a valuable asset to our club. We have cleaned it out twice in the last year, removed the old surf boat and all the old trailers. We had to make room for a new beautiful pink boat and trailer, which has proved another great asset to our club. Pest Control at the shed continues to be an issue, however I think it is under some form of control. We will be getting pests under control before the next season as we do get snakes in there looking for mice. It is a food chain issue really.

During all this year the new club was coming along and I was involved in many meetings regarding set ups, kitchen, bar, plumbing, waste management and lots ancillary items which were a little minor to the overseeing building committee.

Just when you blinked it was November and the move was on. We had to be out of Beachside in a week. What was to come with us, what was going to stay. 2 containers and a shed had to be emptied and removed from the rear of Beachside. Everyone helped. It was a seamless exit.

Then the transition to the new club, wow! When I look back to what we did, was a fantastic example of what all our members can do when needed. Plans were made and changed and then changed again.

21st of December 2023 – Our new club. “You will have nothing to do they said”, “it is all new they said”. Our feet haven’t really touched the ground. As with any new building there are teething issues, and we are getting to all of them. I for one didn’t anticipate the level of usage of our facility. It is sensational. We are still and will continue well into the future, tweaking operations. You will have noticed we have removed the cake fridge and made a bigger coffee area. This is the result of constantly assessing the costs and payoff and tweaking we do. Soon you will be able to order from your tables using your phones. Similar to what we had at our old club.

We are operating to almost our maximum as far as electricity resources are concerned. Our solar system supplements our requirements. We have nothing to put back into the system. We are looking at heating for outside and as you would understand we have to manage what and how we do it.

Currently the second building inspection (every 3 months 1 year) is happening with trades checking everything they have built. We have had some issues and most of them are currently under rectification. The new drip tray attached to the bar is an example of an issue we had with design and building. This has been fixed.

Upstairs exists for downstairs and downstairs has a wow factor attached to it. The racking (which I

wasn’t convinced about), is sensational. And again, we are tweaking to get it better.

Our member facilities are second to none. Change rooms, gym, training room, patrol room, uniforms, first aid room are extremely impressive. There is maintenance which is performed downstairs every week. Shower filters, sand, sand, sand, sand.... Did I mention the sand?

We will be installing more memorabilia upstairs and downstairs, hopefully before the next season. Watch this space.

It is always difficult to thank everyone. From a Facilities point of view I would like to thank –

West Beach Parks – Flexibility for everything we did to them.

Charles Sturt Council – Nothing was too much trouble.

Commercial Operations

The year of 2023/24 this is a report for the future, to be able to go back and know the things we learnt in the rebuild of a club, the running of a separate venue for the club and moving into and commencing trade in our new club.

We had 8 months of trade at Beachside this financial year. During this 8 month period the members patronised the club well. This helped with building and strengthening our finances and culture as a club. Beachside was always set with high tables set in the bar area, these tables were from our old club which gave members a feeling of being at home the smaller room also let everyone bond and make us an even closer club.

As we had always intended to sell Beachside and only run one venue going forward expressions of interest were sort and we had pretty good expressions of interest. After 5 months of haggling we sold Beachside, after paying the loan off to the club that Beachside needed to start up with, the surf club was in the positive for approximately \$340,000 (which came straight off our loan for the new club).

It was in the last 18 months we as the commercial team tried and perfected the food and beverage menus, having tried all aspects of food, beverages and service on the customers at Beachside over the past 18 months, perfecting as we went along and learning what the customers want and expected.

Between November 26th and December 18th we were homeless. During this period we continued with the planning our commercial team had already completed over the previous year. Many many hours were put in to prepare for the opening of our new Club including completely programming our new tills and H&L system, looking at improved

methods of operation, interview and employ staff, organise new menus, signage etc all completed from a private home.

On December 18th we were allowed to get food, beverage and equipment delivered into the new club (after 2pm) this was our first half day to get ready for a trial run which was for invited members only.

On the Wednesday the 20th of December in this trial run we noted and fixed some things we thought we could improve on. With our managers and staff feeling very confident we opened our door to the public at 8am on December the 21st. We got hit hard i think everybody in West Beach knocked off for their Christmas break on this day and came to see their new club. We as a club did the busiest day of trade we had ever had in our entire history and its continued with a few minor hiccups. At the beginning our senior staff Kate, Joshi and Damien made this task pretty seamless - all the previous work had paid off with still much more to come.

Our staff level went from about 23 to 88 and Kate and Joshi. Our team shined under a lot of pressure. We are constantly tweaking the menus and room lay out. The feed back from customers makes us all proud. A lot of the feed back states the West Beach Surf Club has the friendliest staff around and compliments on food are endless.

Thank you to all our staff. Our Team continues to amaze others in the industry in Adelaide for what we have achieved and continue to do.

The project has been formally closed and ongoing improvement works to address either warranty claims or improvements to building operations will continue under the control of the Facilities Director.

The Board and majority of members are delighted with what has been delivered and are confident the new facility will continue to serve the WB community into the future. Inevitably with a

project of this nature, not everything has turned out as expected and/or ideated; if the matter is operationally significant or a warranty issue it will be dealt with straight away, if not then future improvements will be prioritised and funded through the Board.

Thanks are due to the Building committee for their work through the project's conception and duration; their contribution has been invaluable and their commitment recognised and appreciated.

Thanks are also due to the Architect Walter Brook and SLS SA for their support through the project and Partek the Builder.

Compliance and Partnerships

As a Director on the West Beach Surf Life Saving Board, it is imperative to ensure that the Club in both our sporting / club operations and commercial area operates within legal boundaries and upholds ethical standards. Compliance management is crucial not only to avoid legal penalties but also to maintain the integrity and reputation of our club. This role is not popular; however, it is crucial.

Compliance Overview

Compliance within our club encompasses various areas, including but not limited to:

1. **Regulatory Compliance:** Ensuring compliance with local, state, and federal regulations pertaining to sports clubs and emergency services - including Liquor licensing, Council requirements, Department of Human Services (WWCC) Work Health and Safety, Taxation, charitable requirements, Surf Life Saving Australia policies and other regulations.
2. **Ethical Standards:** Upholding ethical principles in all aspects of club operations, including member services, adhering to National Integrity principles, child and youth member protection, financial dealings, and community engagement.
3. **Data Protection:** Safeguarding member data and adhering to privacy regulations and other applicable laws.
4. **Financial Compliance:** Ensuring transparency and accuracy in financial reporting, adhering to accounting standards, and fulfilling tax obligations.

Our most significant challenge this season is the requirement of all members and staff to hold a current WWCC. This process challenging as it is multi-faceted and relies on both members and volunteers communicating and understanding the process. We have put in place various electronic forms to assist, and we hope that moving forward this process will become easier again.

Compliance is a foundational principle that permeates every area of the clubs' operations, culture, and decision-making processes. Compliance features on each agenda for every board meeting and we maintain records of

compliance across portfolios with each Director managing the requirements.

To strengthen compliance management at the Club, the following strategies are recommended:

- **Enhanced Training and Education**
Implement regular training to educate staff and volunteers on compliance requirements, ethical standards, and data protection protocols.
- **Improved Monitoring and Reporting**
Enhance monitoring mechanisms to promptly identify and address compliance issues. Implement robust reporting systems to track compliance metrics and provide regular updates to the board.
- **Strengthened Policies and Procedures:**
We review and update existing policies and procedures to reflect current regulations and best practices. We ensure our policies are available and that we adopt all policies released from our National body and State body. We aim to ensure clear communication and enforcement of these policies throughout the club.
- **External Audits and Reviews**
- **Conduct periodic external audits and reviews** to assess compliance levels objectively and identify areas for improvement. Use resources and experts to provide guidance on complex compliance matters.

Effective compliance management is essential for the Club to uphold its reputation, maintain legal integrity, and foster trust among members and stakeholders. By implementing the proposed strategies for improvement, we can strengthen our compliance efforts and ensure the long-term success of our club.

Marketing

To reflect on the marketing efforts undertaken this season in promoting the rebuild, our events,

engagement of stakeholders, and changing our logo, I feel this has been effective and successful. We have improved in all areas of our multichannel promotion. We have used a multichannel approach to reach a diverse audience, including our membership base, previous members, the community, and other stakeholders.

1. Mailchimp has been used for emailing newsletters and communicating more broadly with the external community.
2. Social media platforms (Facebook and Instagram) are used to generate buzz, share event details, and encourage participation through engaging content, polls, and countdowns. Our reach on our socials for the 12 months was a whopping 243.7K and visits to Facebook was 40.2K. This makes us very appealing for sponsors and potential sponsors who will see value in a partnership.
3. Website utilisation.
We publish event announcements and updates on the website to ensure visibility among internal and external audiences.

With the opening of the new club, we split our social media channels and have two separate pages for the lifesaving operations and for the bar and bistro. This is especially important for our brand and for our commercial operations to distinguish the purpose of each area, whilst recognising they are linked.

Branding and Design

Rebranding and refreshing our logo was an exciting process to be part of. The club engaged Black Sheep Advertising and the result was spectacular! As a member-based organisation, it was critical to engage our members in this process and we conducted surveys as the best method of gaining feedback.

The new logo was created, to coincide with the new building development.

Black Sheep said *“The new logo is contemporary and portrays the spirit of the ocean. The stylised*

waves are simple yet convey a sense of movement to depict rolling waves. The waves hug the type, connecting both elements, giving the logo a unified feel. The colour selections work in harmony and represent the oceans different shades in shallow and deep water. The type face is modern, and welcoming, with clear legibility which is paramount when used across multiple applications.”

As the 2023/24 Surf Life Saving Season comes to a close, we reflect on the dedication and hard work of all our members who have patrolled our beaches, responded to emergencies and developed and learnt new skills whilst educating the public.

This season looked different to last, starting out at three separate locations of Henley Sailing Club, Beachside and shipping containers in the car park, to then moving to the new club after a long-awaited arrival.

Similarly, to last season, we had 10 patrol groups looking after our beach as well as our Emergency Operations Group and Nipper Water Safety. I would like to thank all of our Patrol Captains, Vice Captains and Patrolling Members this season, especially our new Patrol Captains and new vice captains. If you are willing to become a Patrol Captain, please contact the Lifesaving Services Director.

This season we had a few Emergency Call outs with one stand out story. Steve, James, Stephen, Jim and Ellen were at the surf club for emergency response meeting, when they received an activation call informing them an individual in an inflatable boat, was in trouble. having been blown offshore at 7.40 pm. Launching the IRB from Henley Sailing Club (for the last time before the final shift to the new club!) Steve and James proceeded to search the area, about 300m

offshore. Not seeing anyone in the vicinity, they scanned the horizon and spotted an object directly into the setting sun. Racing to beat complete darkness, they reached the inflatable boat, now well over 1km offshore, and with the assistance from radio communication from the beach with Ellen and SAPOL, were able to return the relieved individual safely to his family. Always ensure you check your ability and wear the appropriate safety gear, you check the weather, water and wind conditions before you enter and watch for changes.

Thank you to the lifesaving services team which filled critical roles making sure the equipment was always ready for operation and there was always first aid supplies available.

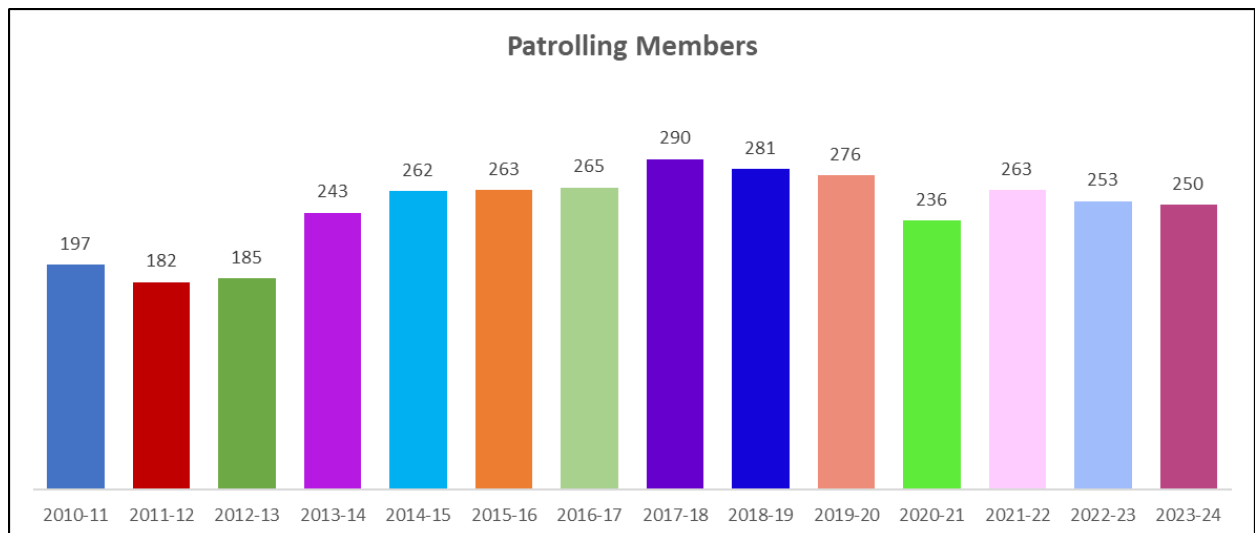

Junior and Youth Development

Our numbers continued to steadily grow again this season, with around 240 junior members. This is a testament to the effort of all of our volunteers in making our program and club. Our largest age group, Under 9 has 35 members (this is a testament to Sally, Ly and Terri who have been exceptional in managing this group!).

The year at a glance

We held our first new Juniors Committee meeting mid year, to prepare for the season ahead. Outside of the many hours on the beach, our leadership team also attend committee meetings, and support the development of our program.

In August we started our pre-season get together with a Quiz Night, hosted at the Henley Sailing Club. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank the Henley Sailing Club members for all of their support for our program over the last two years – it has given us a place to host presentations and celebrations, and ensured we were able to .

In September for the second year we ran a pre-season launch for the Nippers program, also held at the Henley Sailing Club. The sessions have become an important way to share information about the upcoming season's program, and give people the opportunity to ask questions about what it means to be involved in our club.

Most of last year's Under 13s returned to complete their Surf Rescue Certificate. In addition to undertaking patrols, this group have provided age group manager assistance, and water cover at carnivals. Their involvement has been key to our program this year.

We began our season at Immanuel College iSwim, which has become an excellent way to kick off the season during weather which is still a little cool, and allows us to conduct proficiency tests in a safe way, before we start in the ocean. Thank you to

Carol and the team at iSwim for their support of our Nippers this year.

City of Charles Sturt Council again supported us to run the first half of our season from Cynthia and Harold Anderson Reserve, just next to the Surf Avenue car park. Our makeshift uniform shop and canteen was faithfully set up and packed down every week.

Our Under 12 and Under 13 cohort attended our annual Nippers Camp at West Beach Caravan Park. From all reports it was enjoyed by all – thank you to those parents and helpers who stayed at the caravan park across the weekend and supported the kids.

December gave us an opportunity to celebrate at a BBQ at the reserve, with a visit from Santa (thank you!) and gifts for all the Nippers. This was topped only by (FINALLY!) opening the new club, and slowly moving our equipment in to our new home.

For the last couple of years, the Nippers team have also run the BBQ and drinks at the West Beach Primary School Christmas Concert, providing us with the opportunity to support our local community, and raise funds for Nippers equipment.

This year we purchased new 20 foamies for the Nippers. The support of the Board and members is very much appreciated, our huge numbers and having to trailer equipment for the last few years has meant that our stocks of equipment have become low, so replenishing this has been appreciated by all the Nippers team.

Several of our older nippers members participated in the weekly club swim. This was a fantastic opportunity to mix with senior members of the club, and get experience with longer ocean swimming. We're investigating options to open this to parents as well next season, we look forward to as many members as possible joining in.

As we headed toward the end of the season, West Beach nippers represented their club proudly at the State Championships, with an overall result of 6th in the State. I am so proud of the efforts of all of our competitors, not just for their results, but the way in which they represent their club.

The all age relay was my own personal highlight, and watching our boys bring home a silver medal, and the girls team to be so competitive in the final was spectacular.

The post-states colour fight on West Beach as the sun went down was a 'pinch me' moment as our kids and families celebrated together. It was the perfect way to see out the season.

Maureen has been

teaching with us for the last 6 years and is an amazing part of the program and Jing Lang (Ray) & Yu Fei (Faye) who gained their Austswim teachers accreditation. Sadly Ray & Faye have moved to Melbourne and will be missed. With the new club up and running and with a great training room this year we will be holding water safety information seminars for community groups. These will be held with the help of our bilingual members to explain water safety.

Not only are they driving improvements within our squad, but they're also raising the standard of board paddling statewide through fierce yet respectful competition.

While the Male Board area may not boast extensive depth currently, each athlete finished the season with exceptional results. It was exciting to witness Matt and Felix competing as Board paddlers in the SA Surf League, consistently elevating the quality of our training sessions alongside Aiden. At the States, Felix and Aiden secured fourth and fifth place respectively in the Open Board race. Additionally, there were notable achievements in the age group categories, with Felix claiming Silver in the U19 Board race and Aiden earning Bronze in the U17 category. Teaming up with Lochie, the boys won Silver in the U19 Board relay.

Harrison continued to demonstrate his determination in board paddling, transitioning seamlessly from nippers to claim Gold in the U14 Male Board race. Together with Oscar and Nic, the trio delivered a commendable fourth-place finish in the U15 board relay.

The Female contingent adds depth and vibrancy to our training sessions, balancing competitiveness with camaraderie. Despite a slight decrease in depth compared to previous years, Leila, Daisy, and Stella combined their talents to secure a solid fourth place in the Open Female Board Relay. Notable performances included Ginger, Ella, and Jade finishing eighth in the U15 Board relay, and Edie, Zara, and Maisy claiming Silver in the U17 category.

One of the standout moments at Senior States was Edie, Zara, and Daisy's triumphant Gold win in the U19 Board relay, with Daisy's exceptional paddle proving decisive. In individual events, Daisy, Leila, and Edie secured third, fourth, and sixth place respectively in the Opens. Jade's Bronze win in the U14 Board race and several top-ten finishes in the age group categories underscored the depth of talent among the girls.

However, the pinnacle of achievement in the Female area this season belonged to Daisy. In addition to her stellar team performances, Daisy's resilience shone through when, despite narrowly missing out on a medal in her U19 board race due a small wave not being on her side, she graciously congratulated her competitors and then rallied to win Bronze in the Open Female Board Final. Her consistent dedication and unwavering focus throughout the season earned Daisy the prestigious West Beach Board Area Award.

Ski

The Ski area remained bustling with activity this season, as per usual. Despite a smaller contingent of athletes making the trip to the Gold Coast for the Coolangatta Gold, a dedicated training group persisted throughout the chilly winter months. Preparations for Coolie also involved several athletes participating in the SA Ocean Paddlers Downwind Series, yielding commendable results. A special mention goes to Aiden Carberry, who claimed victory in the Junior

Category and secured fourth place overall, setting the stage for an impressive performance in the Short Course Coolangatta Gold where he finished fourth overall and first in the U17 category.

Despite the reduced availability of senior paddlers, our Open Male Ski area delivered a solid performance yet again. In the Open Ski final, Owen secured sixth place, Aiden twelfth, and Jesse fifteenth. Felix claimed fourth in the U19 Male Ski final, while Owen and Glenn joined forces and paddled strongly to win back to back Gold in the Open Double Ski, where Jesse and Aiden finished fifth. In the relay events, Jesse, Owen, and Glenn put in a commendable effort to secure fourth place in the Open Ski relay, while Aiden, Felix, and Lochie achieved the same in the U19 category, facing tough competition throughout. Aiden's outstanding season on the Ski was highlighted by his victories in the Youth Ski Race at interstates, Gold in the State U17 Ski race, and a thrilling Gold win at Aussies in the U17 ski race. Aiden has had an amazing year on the Ski and it is so good to see him rewarded for his efforts over the season by winning the Ski Award for the season.

The Female Ski area has maintained consistent performance in recent years. Edie secured third place in the U17 Ski race, with Georgia finishing eleventh in the Open Ski race. Transitioning to the Opens, the girls formed two teams, with Jess, Leila, and Jo finishing fifth and Stella, Kelsey, and Edie securing tenth place.

Overall, the Ski area retains its strength, earning the Ski Pennant for the season, albeit lacking the depth seen in previous years. However, the emergence of young competitors stepping up in relays and delivering commendable results bodes well for the future. With opportunities to cultivate both depth and quality in the coming years, the future appears promising for the Ski area.

Beach

This season, our beach area comprised a smaller contingent compared to previous years. Despite the reduced numbers, the athletes competing in beach events achieved notable success, particularly in long-distance runs.

At States, we witnessed impressive performances in the long-distance events, starting with Jess securing Bronze in the Open Female 2km Beach Run. Jess and Stella then teamed up to win Silver in the Open Female 2x1km Beach Relay. Aiden represented the Male area admirably, earning Bronze in the U17 2km Beach Run and later partnering with Matt to claim silver in the Open 2x1km Beach Relay.

Our younger athletes kicked off their Senior season with vigor, with Robin winning silver in the U14 2km Beach Run and Harrison securing fourth place in the male event.

While the majority of our Beach results stem from distance events, we're also seeing promising sprinters emerging from the Youth age groups. Chantelle Hockley impressed in the U15 Female Beach Sprints, finishing seventh in the final and following it up with a sixth-place finish in the U15 Beach Flags. Jade demonstrated her versatility by finishing 12th in the U14 Flags at states despite a busy schedule in the ocean.

Overall, the Beach area presents an opportunity for growth within our club. We're beginning to establish the coaching foundation to nurture the potential talent emerging from the younger age groups. It's essential for us to support members in their efforts to strengthen the Beach squad wherever possible. In the coming seasons, we anticipate significant growth in this area, with results to match.

We extend our congratulations to everyone on a fantastic season. It's inspiring to witness the squad evolving together, consistently pushing themselves and each other to excel. The West Beach spirit demonstrated on the beach, within the club, and during training sessions is truly remarkable. We're excited to see the continued realization of potential within this group and eagerly anticipate what Season 2024/25 has in store.

The remedial swim group who are a good example of the individuals who gain the most from these swims but are also the most supportive, even helping out when a sand-bar is non-existent.
